The **Special Education endorsement major in Learning Disabilities** (State code: SM) for Secondary teaching certificate consists of a minimum of 43 credits. Teacher candidates pursuing this major must also complete requirements for a minor in English or Mathematics.

Teacher candidates for certification must pass the Michigan Test for Teacher Certification (MTTC) in Learning Disabilities (Test #063). MTTC content exams should not be taken until 90% of course work in the subject area has been completed. A study guide is available at the MTTC website:
